

# Macedonian Call

## August 2018



Our good friend, Abraham Thomas of Agape Royal Ministries in India, sent the following message via email update: "After August 17, the government of Nepal will enforce an anti-conversion law. It will be a crime to convert anyone from one religion to the other. Christians are so concerned. We have church plants in Nepal and intend to conduct two pastors' conferences in December 2018. Please pray." In a recent National Public Radio article Nepal, which is primarily Hindu (more than 80%), was identified as having one of the world's fastest growing Christian populations. Census records dating back to 1951 indicated that there were ZERO Christians in Nepal and just 458 in 1961. By 2001, there were nearly 102,000. In 2011 that number had more than tripled to more than 375,000. I discovered that while the nation's "constitution establishes Nepal as a 'secular state' but defines secularism as 'protection of the age-old religion and culture and religious and cultural freedom.' It provides for the right to profess and practice one's own religion. The constitution prohibits converting persons from one religion to another, and bans religious behavior disturbing public order or contrary to public health, decency, and morality." The law referenced by Abraham is the conclusion to a criminal code signed into law in October 2017 and

criminalizes the harming of the "religious sentiment" of any caste, ethnic community, or class, either in speech or writing. I often ask you to pray for the threats facing religious liberty in our state and nation. While I've shared with you many examples of such threats over recent years, what we face is miniscule when compared to what our brothers and sisters in Christ deal with in other nations. Hearing news like this should stir within us an appreciation for the freedoms that we do have and stimulate us to pray for Agape Royal Ministries and Nepalese believers. Thanks ~ Pastor Randy

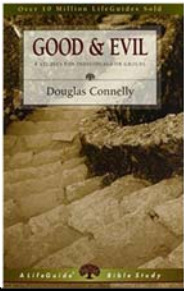

Are you wrestling with a trial right now that has you almost at the end of your rope? Something you can't shake, understand or deal with? So what is your advice you ask? Two things; One, think of the song *Trust and obey*. Verse 3 says:
