

Here am I



It's amazing how our lives change over the course of a year. We become another year older. We lose loved ones. We welcome new members into our families through births or marriages. Our careers move in new directions. We deal with unexpected health issues that alter our lifestyles. Some of our kids start school while others move onto college and some complete their education. Based on previous history, I know 2019 will be full of changes that will affect our lives. Some changes will be dramatic. Some changes will pass by with little notice. In lives filled with change it's comforting to know that there is one constant—God. God does not change. His life doesn't change. He is "from all eternity" (Ps. 93:2). Created things have a beginning and an ending, but not their Creator. He exists forever and He's always the same. The God of the Bible is the same God today. God's character doesn't change. While circumstances may influence our character—for better or worse—God's character is unalterable. He is always holy, just, benevolent, pure, perfect, etc. In Exodus 3:14 He announced to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM." This name serves as a reminder that God has life in Himself, and that what He is now, He is eternally. God's truth doesn't change. We're living in a time when truth is perceived by many as either being fluid or even non-existent. The psalmist said that all of God's commands are truth and they have been established to last forever (Ps. 119:151-52). 1 John 5:20 says: "And we know that the Son of God has come and has given us an understanding, that we may know Him who is true; and we are in Him who is true, in His Son Jesus Christ. This is the true God and eternal life." God's ways don't change.

He continues to act toward His creation the way He did in the Bible. His goals and principles of action are consistent. There are no times when He acts out of character. God's purposes don't change. "God is not a man, that He should lie, nor a son of man, that He should repent. Has He said, and will He not do? Or has He spoken, and will He not make it good?" (Num. 23:19). God's plans never change because they are made on the basis of perfect and complete knowledge of the past, present and future. The psalmist wrote: "The counsel of the Lord stands forever, the plans of His heart to all generations" (Ps. 33:11). God's Son doesn't change. "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever" (Heb. 13:8). He never changes. He still saves. He still loves. He still intercedes. He's still with us. The Christ of the Gospels is the Christ we have privilege of knowing today. So, as you begin to experience changes during this new year, be encouraged that the One "who holds your breath in His hand and owns all your ways" (Dan. 5:23) will not change. Therefore, you can trust Him to be the stabilizing influence in your life. Happy New Year, Pastor Randy

We have a meal each C.A.R.E. Night beginning at 6:00 pm and ministry opportunities follow at 6:30 pm.


This month C.A.R.E. Night is January 9th.
