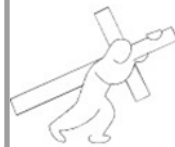


Macedonian Call

March 2020

Abraham Lincoln said the following in March 1863 in his proclamation of a national day of fasting: "May we not justly fear that the awful calamity of Civil War, which now desolates the land, may be but a punishment, inflicted on us, for our presumptuous sins, to the needful end of our national reformation as a whole People? We have been the recipients of the choicest bounties of Heaven. We have been preserved, these many years, in peace and prosperity. We have grown in numbers, wealth and power, as no other nation has grown. But we have forgotten God." With the political strife emanating from our nation's capital, the antagonistic language heard on campaign trials, the constant assault on religious liberty, the shutting down of free speech on college campuses and the persistence of progressives to pass unconstitutional laws, it may be said that our nation is once again engaged in a "Civil War." Is it possible that we are again experiencing "punishment . . . for our presumptuous sins"? For they are many! Abortion, euthanasia (legal in almost half our states), same-sex marriage and the increased acceptance of multiple gender identities come to mind. We have grown in number (over 329 million people). We have grown in wealth (all leading economic indicators are up & unemployment is down). We have grown in power (we have approximately 1.3 million active-duty troops, with another 865,000 in reserve, one of the largest fighting forces of any country & our 2020 military budget is \$748 billion). It's obvious today, as it was to Lincoln in his day, "We have been the recipients of the choicest bounties of Heaven. . . . But we have forgotten God." Unity ("national reformation as a whole people") will never exist without a national turning back to the one true God who has preserved this nation since its inception. Pray for revival in our nation. "Then

we will not turn away from You; revive us, and we will call on Your name" (Psalm 80:18, NIV).

“To me, this verse means...” should not be the first response we give to Bible reading. Scripture should be applied individually but only after the broader meaning of the text is understood (Eph. 5:17). Sometimes we can innocently twist Scripture by reading a passage in isolation, not asking questions of the text or just looking for a quick spiritual pick-me-up. Not every wrong reading of Scripture leads to direct danger but the pattern of surface reading can be damaging over the long term (Rom. 16:18, 2 Tim. 4:3-4). Understanding the Bible rightly is not effortless but remember that as we read humbly, prayerfully, with a desire to know God and His will, the Holy Spirit will guide us and keep us (Matt. 7:7, Luke 11:13, Luke 13:24, John 16:13, James 1:5-6).
